FOR THE SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST:

(1 Corinthian 11: $23-26-2^{nd}$ Reading)

Like Mark, Matthew, Luke and John, Paul is an evangelist. Like them, his purpose is not to share memories of an admired but deceased teacher, but to proclaim a living Lord who is still intimately connected to his beloved followers. Imagine Paul sitting among new converts, perhaps in secret, sharing these sacred words that not only recall what Jesus did, but make him present among those gathered. Paul is not repeating a "formula" for them to memorize. His are words that elicit tears and sighs of gratitude. They evoke the Lord who willingly gave himself to become food for us. He spoke those words, at the same time instructing that we repeat them often so that we would know we're not left orphaned, that our fears could be blotted out and our hunger fed, and so that we would never forget the God who became one of us so we could become like him.

(*Luke 9:11b-17 – Gospel*)

This dramatic narrative recounted in all four Gospel accounts, heralds the abundance of God's Kingdom. It witnesses to the power of God to overcome our insufficiency and overwhelm us with plenty. Claims that Jesus facilitated sharing among the crowd misses the point; this text declared that no human effort is enough to fulfill our deepest hungers, for only God can do that. This is not a story of hungry bellies filled; it is an enacted parable that announces God can fill what's hardest of all to fill: the human heart.


