For the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity:

Today we rejoice in the revelation of the Holy Trinity. It is upon this reality that Christianity is built. One of the most radical revelations of Jesus is that God is in Himself community, that we are made in God's image and likeness, and that in Christ we are to become like God. God is Three Persons, a community of Persons that exists in love. That is the inner nature of God, that is the life of heaven, and that is what we are called to live here on earth.

It is interesting to note that in the Book of Genesis we find God saying: "Let us make man in our image..." We are called into existence, to be in and to live in a relational existence. We discover our selves, we find the meaning of life, and we know who we are when we see and understand our selves in the eyes of those who know us, who love us, and who relate to us. It is for this that we praise and thank God in the Preface of today's Mass. We give Him thanks always and everywhere because He is more than solitary. We praise God because He is a union of Persons who are absolutely in love and in total union with each other. What a blessing that is for you... a blessing because if you lived just with your self and for your self life would be horrible.

This belief in the Holy Trinity rests upon Christ's life and is found in His continual references to His Father in heaven and to the Spirit of God. Belief in the Holy Trinity does not come to us from the thoughts of men, nor is it a construct produced from deep within the psychological recesses of our human subconsciousness. It is not a doctrine found in any of the other great religions in human history, nor did any philosopher ever teach it. It is beyond human speculations about what kind of a god God really is. It's beyond any human thought about what God might be like. Yet it is central and vital to the message of the Gospels, the faith of the Apostles, and consequently to our faith.
