## For the Most Holy Trinity (1<sup>st</sup> Reading from Deuteronomy):

This excerpt comes from the Book of Deuteronomy, which contains a series of speeches that Moses delivers to the Israelites on the plains of Moab, just east of the Jordan River. In the storyline of the Pentateuch, the Israelites have finally reached the end of their forty-year journey through the wilderness, and are on the brink of entering the Promised Land. It is a time of great anticipation for the people, who have waited so long to arrive at their destiny. The group to whom Moses was speaking was largely composed of the children born in the wilderness, those who never experienced slavery the way their parents had in Egypt. Much of what Moses has to say is intended to remind them of the lessons learned by their parents while in the wilderness.

Moses uses the arrival to remind the Israelites of the history they shared for nearly a generation. Foremost on Moses' mind is the Lord, the God of Israel, who called him to lead Israel out of Egyptian slavery. The dramatic events, associated not only with Israel's rescue from slavery but also with the many perils faced over the forty years in the desert, were Moses' most effective means of teaching the Israelites about God. Historians date these events of the Exodus around 1200 BC, a period in history when the people of the Near East believe in many gods. Moses' insistence that there are "no other" gods except the one "Lord" is the theme in today's reading and throughout his speeches in Deuteronomy. Odd as

it may seem, monotheism (belief in one God) was a relatively foreign concept to Israel and the other nations of the region.

Moses saw the Promised Land as a precious gift from God. His desire for the Israelites was that they would enjoy "wellbeing" and "long remain in the land." To do so, the Israelites must believe only in the one God of Israel: "Take to heart" that there is "no other" God in heaven or on earth. Second, they are to be faithful to the Law received by God at Mount Sinai: "Keep his statues and commandments."


