For All Saints:

Today the often misunderstood Book of Revelation presents a great vision of those saved in and through Jesus Christ, the Lamb of God who died but now lives forever as witness to God's life-giving power. This book originates in apocalyptic thought, which often appears in times of distress or persecution. Apocalyptic literature intends to give hope to suffering people by presenting God bringing the divine plan to completion, often with a final battle between forces of good and evil, ending with God's triumph over the twin evils of sin and death. In the first century, apocalyptic visions commonly culminated in a final judgement and due reward for good or evil conduct in this world. The author of Revelation wrote at a time of Roman persecution of Christians when he himself was imprisoned for his witness to Christ. As is common in apocalyptic writings, he used multiple symbols.

Immediately before today's reading, John described 144,000 persons to be marked with a seal as servants of God. This symbolic number is derived by repeated multiplication of the numbers ten, symbolizing perfection and completion, and twelve, representing the twelve tribes of Israel. Since the Christian community considered itself the new Israel of the final age, 144,000 persons sealed stand for the entire community of faithful believers saved by God. They wear white and carry palms, symbolizing joy, glory, and victory. The victory, of course, is not their own but that of God and the Lamb, the risen Christ, to whom they offer praise and thanks. They have remained faithful, even in the face of suffering and death for their faith in Christ, and so at His coming in glory they share in God's final salvation. In and through the sacrificed Lamb of God, now raised to fullness of life, they too pass through death to greater life.

child (of any age) with a place to visit that has been especially reserved for meditation, prayer, tears and inner healing.


