### Why do we offer Mass for the repose of souls? (Excerpts from Catholic Straight Answers website)

The practice of offering the holy Mass for the repose of the soul of the deceased originates in the early church. The catechism teaches, "From the beginning the church has honoured the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God" (No. 1032).

Praying for the repose of the souls of the deceased is rooted in the OT. Judas Maccabees offered prayers and sacrifices for the Jewish soldiers who had died wearing pagan amulets, which were forbidden by the Torah. 2 Maccabees reads, "Turning to supplication, they prayed that the sinful deed might be fully blotted out" (12:43). Continuing, "(Judas Maccabees) took up a collection among all his soldiers, ... which he sent to Jerusalem to provide for an expiatory sacrifice. In doing this he acted in a very excellent and noble way, inasmuch as he had the resurrection of the dead in view; for if he were not expecting the fallen to rise again, it would have been useless and foolish to pray for them in death. But if he did this with a view to the splendid reward that awaits those who had gone to rest in godliness, it was a holy and pious thought. Thus, he made atonement for the dead that they might be freed from sin".

In light of the saving work of Our Lord Jesus Christ, we believe that when a person dies, he faces his particular judgment and must render an account of his life. If that person has died fundamentally believing in God and in a state of grace, but with venial sins and the hurt caused by sin, then God in His divine love and mercy will first purify the soul. After this purification has been completed, the soul will have the holiness and purity needed to share in the beatific vision in heaven.

The faithful on earth can help those souls undergoing purification. The Vatican Council II affirmed: "This sacred council accepts lovally the venerable faith of our ancestors in the living communion which exists between us and our brothers who

are in the glory of heaven or who are yet being purified after their death." Therefore, just as we pray for each other and share each other's burdens now, the faithful on earth can offer prayers and sacrifices to help the departed souls undergoing purification, and no better prayer could be offered than the Mass.

This belief has roots also in the early history of the church. Inscriptions uncovered on tombs in the Roman catacombs evidence this practice. The Canons of Hippolytus (c. 235AD), one of the earliest missals, explicitly mentions the offering of prayers for the dead during the Mass. St. Ambrose (d. 397AD) preached, "We have loved them during life; let us not abandon them in death, until we have conducted them by our prayers into the house of the Lord."

When we face the death of someone, even a person who is not Catholic, to have a Mass offered for the repose of his soul and to offer our prayers are more beneficial than sympathy cards or flowers. Most importantly, we always should remember our own dearly departed loved ones in the holy Mass and through our own prayers and sacrifices to help in their gaining eternal rest. Let us keep in our prayers all of our faithful departed.


News from Canadian Food for Children: Toronto Warehouse has suspended operations at this point. Herb

Wittich Depot in Kitchener is suspending reception of goods because the Toronto is not accepting shipments. This past summer, the main warehouse in Toronto was receiving more donations of food and goods than normal and was shipping an average of 1.5 containers per day. Depending on the destination, the cost of shipping one container varies from \$3,000 to \$8,000 USD. Also, financial donations are usually lighter in the summer and were even lower this summer. Therefor the Toronto operation had to suspend the shipment of containers. The hope and the prayer is that an increase in financial support will reestablish the flow of help to the needy in the Third World.
