Reflection on the First Reading: Wisdom 6:12-16

Today's reading from Wisdom is part of an exhortation given to kings and magistrates. The author addresses his readers as judges (1:1) and princes (6:21). Royal persons were symbols in Greek culture of the ideal human person; by addressing his audience this way, the writer intends to inspire everyone to reach for the virtues of the ideal ruler. Shortly after advising his audience to learn wisdom, the writer describes wisdom in the lovely poetry of today's reading.

In this book, as well as other wisdom literature (Proverbs, The Song of Songs, and Sirach), wisdom is portrayed as a woman. Here, she is "resplendent [radiant] and unfading," signalling a perennial and extensive beauty. While at times she seems hidden, those who love her and seek her can readily find her. In fact, she desires to make herself known, and the task of the writer is to reveal her identity. Recognizing her requires constancy and engagement of one's whole person in the pursuit: desiring her, watching for her, setting one's heart on her, keeping vigil for her. She is sitting at the gate, but will be missed by those who are not attentive. The seeking and attention required of those who desire her is matched by wisdom's own seeking and attentiveness.

When the many passages presenting wisdom are brought together, her portrait comes very close to that of God. In this passage, the writer begins a sketch of her that will be more fully drawn in the subsequent chapters of the book; each added dimension presents her as intimately connected both with God and with humanity.

The verses (17-20) that follow today's reading describe the right attitude of one's heart and what it leads to:

"The beginning of wisdom is the most sincere desire for instruction, and concern for instruction is love of her, and love of her is the keeping of her laws, and giving heed to her laws is assurance of immortality, and immortality brings one near to God; so the desire for wisdom leads to a kingdom.'
