For 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time:

The Book of Daniel is a work of apocalyptic literature. The unknown author describes a historical setting during the Babylonian captivity, but the book was written centuries later, most likely during the religious persecution of Jews under the Seleucid King Antiochus IV, 167 - 164 BC. Like all apocalyptic writings, this work seeks to give believers hope by looking forward to God's definitive intervention in human affairs, which puts an end to the domination of all evil powers, earthly and heavenly. Part of apocalyptic thought includes expectation of conflict and distress that signals God's coming, a final battle between the powers of good and evil, and a final judgement at which the righteous and unrighteous will be rewarded according to their deeds.

Daniel, portrayed as a prophet, receives the word of the Lord describing the nearness of God's final act. As the last battle between good and evil approaches, the archangel Michael will appear to protect God's people. While not named an angel in this passage, this figure is usually identified with the mighty angel who battles Satan in Revelation 12:7. Names "written in the book" imply final judgment. The lines that follow clearly describe the separation and appropriate fate of the unjust and the just; the just are "the wise" who follow and trust in the Lord's teaching. This text represents one of the clearest Old Testament references to belief in eternal life for the righteous; it is this trust that offers hope to Jews suffering persecution and to faithful believers to this day.


