For the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time (2nd Reading):

Christians have been fascinated with end-times since the Church's beginnings. It's easy to dismiss such thought as the mindless speculation of uninformed fanatics who seek what was never promised. And, indeed, such is often the case with doomsayers who predict the 'end' is waiting around the calendar's next corner. But, in part, that fascination finds its roots in Scripture that speaks of "signs of the times" that ought no to be missed and calls for readiness hen the time of judgment comes. Each year, the final weeks of our liturgical cycle bring those readings to us in order to remind us that vigilance is necessary and that being always in a ready state is not optional for the faithful Christian.

However, those who claim knowledge of the time of the Lord's return forget that such knowledge cannot be had and that anyone who claims to have it is a fraud. So we live in tension, recognizing the need to be watchful and prepared but realizing that no matter what, the "day of the Lord" will inevitably come unexpectedly, "like a thief in the night."

Paul has another even more important point: while the Thessalonians live in constant vigilance, they must focus on the now, aware that they have already begun living in the future life they anticipate. Right now, because of Baptism, they are "children of light... of the day." Already we experience that future life that will be fully ours only when we are wrapped within God's full embrace. A reveille call ends the passage with Paul telling us to do two things: be alert and be clear-headed.

Wilfred Robert Bauer (Nov. 29m 1893 – Oct. 11, 1918) was one of the 16 men from Waterloo who died as a result of World War I.
