Reflection on the Gospel: Luke 21:5-19

With the magnificent temple in Jerusalem in the background, Jesus addresses the people for the final time before His Passion. He begins by telling them that the temple will be destroyed. Without specifying the time, He says, "the days will come "when this will happen, reminiscent of Malachi's writing of the Day of the Lord, the great and terrible day. Like Malachi's prophecy, Jesus speaks of a coming time of great devastation and turmoil. His speech is often referred to as His eschatological discourse; eschatology treats of the events that are connected with the "end," sometimes dealing with the fate of individuals, but more broadly with God's final, triumphant conquering of evil and the vindication of the just.


Although the time when the end will come is uncertain, it is nonetheless assured that it will come. With the vivid imagery common to other scenarios of the last days, Jesus speaks of widespread human conflict as well as the upheaval of nature itself. Jesus' followers will experience more immediate suffering: they will be persecuted and imprisoned because of their faith in Jesus. Some will be betrayed by families, and some put to death. Yet death will not destroy them. By their steadfastness, they will be saved. In the Gospel account, Jesus is speaking before the destruction of the temple, which happened in the year 70AD, decades after Jesus' lifetime. Heard by the later Church, Jesus' words carry the same note of being faithful to the end, enduring the suffering that will surely come to Jesus' followers, and relying on His promise and presence. The message is relevant to the Church of any generation.



Excerpts from the Catechism of the Catholic Church:

MAN'S VOCATION: LIFE IN THE SPIRIT -THE VIRTUES

1803 "Whatever is true, whatever is honourable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things." (*Phillipians 4:8*) A virtue is an habitual and firm disposition to do the good. It allows the person not only to perform good acts, but to give the best of himself. The virtuous person tends toward the good with all his sensory and spiritual powers; he pursues the good and chooses it in concrete actions. "The goal of a virtuous life is to become like God." (St. Gregory of Nyssa, De beatitudinibus, 1:PG 44,1200D)

1804 Human virtues are firm attitudes, stable dispositions, habitual perfections of intellect and will that govern our actions, order our passions, and guide our conduct according to reason and faith. They make possible ease, self-mastery, and joy in leading a morally good life. The virtuous man is he who freely practices the good. The moral virtues are acquired by human effort. They are the fruit and seed of morally good acts; they dispose all the powers of the human being for communion with divine love

The cardinal virtues

1805 Four virtues play a pivotal role and accordingly are called "cardinal"; all the others are grouped around them. They are: prudence, justice, fortitude, and temperance. "If anyone loves righteousness, [Wisdom's] labours are virtues; for she teaches temperance and prudence, justice, and courage." These virtues are praised under other names in many passages of Scripture.

Perseverance in faith

162 Faith is an entirely free gift that God makes to man. We can lose this priceless gift, as St. Paul indicated to St. Timothy: "Wage the good warfare, holding faith and a good conscience. By rejecting conscience, certain persons have made shipwreck of their faith." To live, grow and persevere in the faith until the end we must nourish it with the word of God; we must beg the Lord to increase our faith; it must be "working through charity," abounding in hope, and rooted in the faith of the Church.
