For the Feast of Christ the King – The Last Sunday of the Liturgical Year

Jesus was often called "Son of David". David was Israel's king, both by God's choice and the people's. As David's "son," Jesus can claim the title and throne of His forbearer, and when Jesus takes that throne, it will be forever.

This reading celebrates Christ's kingship by looking back at His ancestry and linking Him with David, who was Israel's greatest king, a man after God's own heart. David ruled a united kingdom and remained Israel's model of the ideal king throughout her history. By conjuring the image of David as the shepherd boy who became the mighty warrior, the liturgy reminds us that Jesus' kingly identity is also multivalent. Like His ancestor, Jesus is shepherd and "ruler" of Israel, who avoids breaking the bruised reed but who assumes His throne as king of kings.

There is a tender relationship between the would-be king and the tribes of Israel that suggests the oneness between God and His people. The tribes characterize themselves as "your bone and flesh," as if they were His progeny rather than His subjects. In David, who represented God's authority on earth, the nation finds both a father and a powerful leader. Of course, David was but a man who possessed tragic flaws. In him we see the foreshadowing of a distant descendant who will also combine compassion and domininion and will ascend a cruciform throne that becomes the seat of life.


