For the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica (2nd Reading):

In the second reading, a building takes on symbolic significance. Paul tells the believers at Corinth that they are "God's building" and that their "foundation" is "Jesus Christ." Essentially, today's feast proclaims the same truth, for it focuses not simply on the walls of a great basilica in Rome, but on the fact that this building is the symbolic home of all Catholics because it is the cathedral church of the Pope, who is father and shepherd of us all. The Lateran is not defined by four walls but by the hearts and souls it encompasses and the oneness it represents.

Such was Paul's agenda in writing today's text. Addressing divisions that centred on the authority of various leaders within the community, Paul states unequivocally that their foundation is Christ. Paul laid that foundation by first teaching them of Christ. Others have built upon it, and now they are a structure strong and secure. No one can lay a new foundation for the foundation they have never will weaken. Their task, Paul tells them, is to recognize what they have become – "God's temple." Within them is where the Lord lives. The Old Testament Temple was seen as God's dwelling place on earth, and therefore its destruction was a devastating blow. But God now has a new temple, "and you are that temple," Paul assures them. This temple can only be destroyed if their faith in God is destroyed. And if anyone were to cause that to come about, "God will destroy that person."

Though written to resolve controversy, in today's context, Paul's words resound with hope and joyful message of oneness in Christ.
