Reflection on the First Reading: Isaiah 5:1-7

Today's reading, a song of a vineyard, is a parable whose meaning is not revealed until the end. The song is sung by Isaiah himself, telling of the vineyard carefully tended by his friend. It is actually the friend's own song, recounting all the labour through each stage of growth – beginning with spading and culminating with the expectation of rich harvest. There is no hint of backbreaking fatigue, just loving attention. With all that care, how could the friend's vineyard produce only wild grapes?

At this point, when Isaiah's audience may be wondering at such an unnatural harvest, the speaker changes. Now it is the owner of the vineyard who addresses them. Clearly the owner has not stinted in any way, and asks the question that has such pathos and emotion in it: "What more was there to do for my vineyard that I have not done in it?" Sadly, having spent so much effort on the vineyard, he will now let it fall into ruin. Even more, the owner says he will command that no rain fall on it. With such a forceful word of authority, we now see the identity of the vineyard owner. It is God speaking, God who has so

lovingly tended the vineyard, who judges it, and announces the coming punishment. The very ones listening to the song are themselves the vineyard, God's cherished plant, and are subject to god's judgement for their failure to produce a good harvest.

With the skill of an accomplished poet, Isaiah concludes with a play on words that evokes the contrast between a good crop of grapes and a worthless harvest. God looked for justice (mishpat), but got instead bloodshed (mispah); God wanted righteousness (sedeq), but heard instead an outcry (se'aqah). Having listened to Isaiah's prophecy, perhaps the people will be moved to repentance.


