For the 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time:

Immediately before today's Gospel passage, Jesus states that only those who accept the Kingdom of God like a child (with a sense of total dependence) will enter it.

Then a man approaches, addressing Jesus as "Good Teacher" and inquiring how to reach eternal life. Jesus first responds to the man's manner of address, pointing away from himself and towards God, who alone is good. Probing further, Jesus reminds the man that he surely knows the way of eternal life, for it is summed up in God's commandment. At the questioner's statement that he has kept these commands from youth, Jesus lovingly tells him that he lacks one thing: to relinquish possessions, share them with the poor, and then follow as disciple. When the man who possesses much turns away, Jesus addresses the disciples with a shocking teaching: it is exceedingly difficult for those with riches to enter the Kingdom of God. Their amazement is most likely rooted in the long-held belief, expressed in the Old Testament, that wealth signified divine favour. But Jesus resists any claim to participation in Kingdom based on wealth and its companions, power and status.

The essence of Jesus' teaching today seems to be the need to accept the Kingdom of God like a child. In Jewish culture of the time, children had virtually no status and no rights, and so totally depended upon others for life and sustenance. Jesus teaches that those who cannot renounce any and all perceived entitlements to sharing in the Kingdom, whether good actions, material riches, prestige, or power, cannot enter. Such total surrender may seem humanly impossible, but by dependence upon God alone, "all things are possible."
