For the 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time (2nd Reading):

Paul has learned a secret from living in scarcity and in abundance. All things are doable and all is tolerable, he says, because of Christ who provides the strength to embrace abundance without pride and endure want without resentment. At the time of this writing, Paul languishes in prison facing death. Yet his spirit is undaunted and he proves the sincerity of his words by being able to express gratitude, speaking words of encouragement, and ending in prayer. Paul was not a victim of circumstances. His secret is that in Christ he found a way to hover above life's circumstances so that when abundance gives way to need and comfort yields to bare necessity, the faith path he walks remains stable and unshaken.

We can almost sense regret that the Philippians have been so generous in sending money not just once but multiple times. Paul has learned to rely solely on God; in this instance at least, the Philippians' generosity has made that unnecessary. Nonetheless, he thanks them sincerely for wanting to relieve his "distress."

Paul ends with assurance that God will repay what he himself cannot, and God will meet their needs as they met his. Because he knows what God has given us in Christ, he can assert with confidence that God will give them everything they need. The final words of the text are a prayer..."To our God and Father be glory forever and ever. Amen."
