## Reflection on the First Reading: Isaiah 25:6-10

In his poem, the Prophet Isaiah depicts the Lord of hosts as a lavish provider, as well as a mighty warrior who is victorious over every evil and source of sorrow, including death itself. The Lord of Hosts is a biblical image of a warrior God who commands the heavenly armies in battle. He is always triumphant, and holds sway over every element of creation. Isaiah emphasizes God's universal power throughout the poem, all peoples, all nations, every face, and the whole earth will experience God's might.

The poem opens with a scene of glad feasting on the mountain, most likely referring to the holy city Jerusalem, the symbolic locale of God's abiding presence. The rich food and drink that God will provide there manifests divine control over nature itself, as God sets plentiful table for all peoples. Following the image of God offering a banquet is one that depicts God's ability to destroy. The power that the Lord of hosts manifests, however, does not bring rampant ruin, for God destroys only that which inhibits life and wholeness. First, God will destroy the veil that veils all peoples, the web over all nations. This veil or web has several possible meanings. We may imagine it as ignorance of God, or as an illusion that confuses and divides people. More concretely, we may see it as the shroud that covers all who die, all nations appear to be wrapped in the mourning veil as a sign of universal grief and death that causes such sadness. When we hear that the Lord God wipes away tears from every face, we can ad another piece in the portrait of God: the one who acts with motherly tenderness.

Those who look to God in hope will not be disappointed, for all God's actions are for the sake of salvation. Most importantly, God's saving actions are for us! The concluding verses are personal acclamations of faith and hope,
