For the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time (1st Reading):

Wielding the staff he previously used to split the Red Sea and to call its destructive waters back down upon Pharaoh's army, Moses intercedes for his people as they engage in the battle against the Amalekites who are trying to deny the Israelites the Promised Land. Noticing that Israel had the better of the fight whenever Moses' arms were upraised, Aaron and Hur help him sustain that posture through the long hours of battle. This cause and effect relationship points to God's mercy, not some sorcery that Moses uses to control God. God remains free, but invites us to intercede, that he might manifest his mercy. That's exactly what we see here: Moses, the nation's leader, not on his own but with the help of assistants, asks God's help, and God manifests it by giving Israel the victory. There is a happy confluence of images: the physical battle of metal meeting metal and spiritual battle as Moses prays to support the men who give their lives to protect the Promised Land.

All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work.
