October 2019 - Extraordinary Missionary Month: Baptized & Sent **St. François de Laval (1623-1708)**



In 1657, the territory of New France had two thousand inhabitants and the essential zeal of colonization degraded. The political intrigues became intermingled and trading was paralyzed. The war with Iroquois, in particular, left behind a

significant number of victims, including many members of the French clergy. Consequently, the Jesuits and the promoters of New France requested the arrival of a bishop; who will be capable of rectifying the situation, and their choice fell on a man of great piety, gifted with rich personality: François de Laval

Driven by a deep faith and an innovative spirit, the prelate marked Canadian history by laying the foundations of a communal and missionary Church, establishing great institutions and handing down an exceptional work to our society.

François de Laval was born into a large French noble family on April 30, 1623. When he was eight years old, he aspired to a religious life, therefore, his parents entrusted his education to the Jesuits, with whom he studied and blossomed. When he was 20 years old, he began his theological studies, which destined him for a brilliant ecclesiastical career and arouse a strong interest within him for the mission in New France. This attraction became more and more intense when he met among others, the Jesuits priests, Énnemond Massé, a missionary pioneer in New France, and Gabriel Lalemant, who will become one of the eight glorious Canadian martyrs.

François de Laval was 23 years old when he became a priest. He was appointed archdeacon in the Diocese of Évreux, a largescale territory. He carried out this task skilfully, gathering in the process, the reputation of a humble and great harvester. He was consecrated bishop in December 1658 and exempted from diocesan responsibility, therefore, he prepared to leave on a mission to Asia. The Providence's hand took him by surprise by answering the deep aspiration of his heart... The governing authorities firmly requested his presence in New France to carry out his episcopal functions. Thus, François de Laval disembarked in Québec on June 16, 1659 as apostolic vicar.

His territory, which had only 27 priests, was vast.. New France stretched out from Hudson Bay to Louisiana, and from Acadia to the plains of Western Canada. His new function didn't give him the and not

without clashes, to make his authority known among the perseverance, extended power of a bishop, so at first, he bustled with governor, the religious communities and the settlers. He carried out two mandates as provisional governor. Also, he devoted himself to establishing relationships with the Aboriginals and protecting their dignity by battling against their exploitation caused by bootlegs.

A skilled leader, instigator of a new era, he devoted himself to building our Church. In 1663, he founded the Seminary of Québec, then, a community of secular priests in charge of local clergy's formation and parochial service. He established, under the canonical law, the first parish in New France, "Notre-Dame-de-Québec," whose integration in the new diocese of Québec, in 1674, resulted in the transformation of a mission territory into a structured Church (in the mid 19C, the parishes of St. Lawrence Valley served for the development of the municipal system). In order to meet the abundant priestly vocations, he founded, in 1668, a seminary, and a school of arts and trades for young people who didn't aspire to priesthood or a professional career.

In 1674, when Québec was granted the status of diocese, Msgr. de Laval became the first bishop of New France until 1688. He died in Québec on May 6, 1708, and was buried in the cathedral.

François de Laval was beatified by Pope John-Paul II on June 22, 1980 and canonized by Pope Francis on April 3, 2014. Excerpt from the website of the Society of the Propagation of the Faith.
