Reflection on the Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 1:1-5ab

The greetings in Paul's letters are more than formal salutations, for they contain rich insights into the life and faith of the early Church. The first words of the letter tell us that Paul is not engaged in the missionary enterprise in isolation; he is joined by his companions, Sylvanus and Timothy. They greet the community in Thessalonica warmly, affirming that the believers

live "in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ." At the end of the greeting, Paul also writes of the power of the Holy Spirit. Taken together, we see here one of the earliest foundations of belief in God as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Through Baptism the Thessalonians have been immersed into this Trinitarian life.



Paul and companions send, as they typically do, their wish of grace and peace, followed by a prayer of thanksgiving. As they recall the reasons for gratitude, we hear another important triad: faith, love and hope. Neither the Thessalonians, nor the missionaries live their communion with God in easy circumstances. In the midst of their affliction, they have endured in hope, a sure and strong sign of their confidence in the God who loves them. The letter writers conclude their salutation by reminding their readers that the Gospel proclaimed by Paul came not only in Word, but also in the power of the Holy Spirit, with much conviction. The same is true for the Gospel lived and proclaimed by the new believers in Thessalonica, and by us as well.
