### For the 30<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time:

Today's healing account in the Gospel of Mark, like other miracle stories in that Gospel, serves to demonstrate that the Kingdom of God truly has begun in Jesus since through Him God overcomes the evil of every kind of illness and suffering. The story of Bartimaeus also closes the important three-part section of the Gospel of Mark in which Jesus attempts in vain to clarify his mission as Suffering Servant of God rather than triumphant earthly king. Immediately after this miracle story, Jesus enters Jerusalem to begin the final act in the drama of the Suffering Servant-Messiah; here, Jesus will fully reveal this identity in word and deed as he willingly enters into his Passion and Death.

Mark employs a technique called "framing," which sets off important content with a similar account at the beginning and end of a section. The elements of the frame serve as a kind of commentary on what appears within it. Two stories of Jesus healing a blind man punctuate Mark's tripartite portrayal of Jesus proclaiming His impending suffering and execution, repeatedly followed by the disciples' lack of understanding and acceptance of this reality. Last Sunday's Gospel revealed the depth of the disciples' failure to comprehend Jesus' message and identity. Their blindness was evident as they bickered over who would hold the position of greatest authority in Jesus' Kingdom.

The process of coming to see happens only gradually and in stages. Even so, the disciples could not - or would not - see the reality of a Messiah who would suffer and die. With the healing of blind Bartimaeus, Mark places before us one who quickly comes to see through the persistence of faith. In Jesus' words "your faith has made you well," we perceive the reality of God's Kingdom: the blind man sees Jesus with the eyes of faith, and so is saved, healed, made whole (the Greek word includes all these meanings). He follows Jesus as a true disciple, on "the way," the earliest term used to describe the followers of Jesus.
