### Reflection on the Gospel: Matthew 22:34-40

In the episode between the last week's Gospel and this week's, Jesus was in controversy with the Sadducees, who did not believe in resurrection. Jesus provides them with an innovative interpretation of the Torah that supports belief in the resurrection, thereby silencing them. The Pharisees, who shared Jesus' belief in the resurrection, would undoubtedly have approved of his teaching. When one of them, a scholar of the Law, asks Jesus which commandment is the greatest, he could be asking a sincere question, one that was, in fact, a subject among contemporary rabbis. Those rabbis arrived at different answers; perhaps this teacher of the Law simply wanted to engage Jesus in debate.

Matthew comments, however, that by posing the question, the scholar "tested" Jesus. Testing here, like the Pharisees' query about paying taxes to Caesar, was an attempt to prove that Jesus had no authority as a teacher. Jesus' answer brings together two positive commandments of the Torah that describe the right relationship with God and neighbour. The first one, love of God with entirety of one's being, is based on the Shema at Deuteronomy 6:5, to which Jesus adds "with all your mind." So important is the Shema in Judaism that it continues to be recited twice daily in our times. The second commandment is from Leviticus 19:18, commanding Israelites to love their neighbours as themselves. While the scholar asked for only one commandment, Jesus gives two, teaching that love of God and love of neighbour are intimately connected and encompass all the other commandments. All of the 613 commandments of the Law are included in these two. In his test, Jesus is faithful to the tradition, and teaches with authority.
