For the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time (1st Reading):

The author of the 1st Reading from Wisdom reflects on God's mercy. Compared with God, the "world" is like a tiny weight used on the most sensitive scales or like a single drop of morning dew. The Bible's starting point is always the greatness of God who, nonetheless, deigns to love and care for us frail creatures like a mother loves the child in her womb. In God's eyes, existence equals goodness because everything God made is good. That goodness precedes any action or accomplishment on our part. We don't earn worthiness, it is bestowed on us as an essential aspect of our existence.

These are not words of a theologian and less those of a lawyer. They are the words of a mother looking at the marvel of the child she has birthed and of a father overwhelmed by his love even for an errant or rebellious child.

In the final sentence an ideal parent or teacher is described, one who motivated by love, never ceases coaxing children to repentance by inviting them, "little by little," to face the sins that dull their senses and keep them from experiencing the fullness of God's love. We are invited to turn from sin in order to taste the sweetness of God's mercy.

"Therefore you correct little by little those who trespass, and you remind and warn them of the things through which they sin, so that they may be freed from wickedness and put their trust in you, O Lord."


