### Reflection on the Second Reading: Philippians 4:6-9

Paul is writing to his beloved Philippian Christians while he is imprisoned and the community itself is facing persecution. Just before these verses, he has told the Church in Philippi to rejoice, for "The Lord is near". Paul's conviction that the risen Lord is present among them and that he will come again in glory is fundamental to everything he says. We can almost hear Paul repeating his belief in the Lord's nearness after each piece of advice. Whether one is imprisoned or enslaved or free, in poverty or in riches, persecuted or honoured, have no anxiety: "The Lord is near." They should offer prayer in all forms, with thanksgiving, confident that God will hear: "The Lord is near." The peace that God will give surpasses understanding. By using the verb "surpassing" (hyperexousa), Paul assures his audience that God's peace is "superior to" human intelligence. By human standards or understanding, both Paul and the Philippian Church have ample reason to experience anxiety, rather than peace. Yet, like a guardian of a fortress, God's peace will protect the entirety of every person, "The Lord is near."

Next, Paul enjoins on the Church specific behaviours or virtues that will bring about peace. Listing virtues and vices was a common practice in Paul's Hellenistic millieu, including in the New Testament. Jews, Gentiles, Christians, and Greek philosophers all used these catalogues as a technique to promote right living. Paul not only exhorts the community to manifest whatever is true, honourable, just, and worthy of praise; he also tells them that they are to *think* about these qualities. Paul seems to suggest a meditative stance in support of virtuous living: *think* about what you are doing. They are also to observe Paul's own behaviour, for his life was patterned on Christ's. Bringing his advice to a close, Paul again promises God's peace. We can again say with him: "The Lord is near."


