

For the 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time (1st Reading):

It is important to know what happened before today's passage in 2 Kings 5. Naaman, army commander and foreign dignitary, has come to Israel in the hope of curing his leprosy. His hopes are dashed when Elisha simply sends word for him to bathe in the Jordan rather than making some grand spectacle of healing. Angry and disappointed, Naaman prepares to leave, but is persuaded by his servants who tell him that he has nothing to lose in following Elisha's instructions.

Naaman, in the grip of gratitude, embraces the God of Israel as earth's only god and promises to worship no other. Back home duty will bind him to worship his nation's god, yet he boldly makes a declaration. Believing that gods could be worshipped only in their own land, he asks for soil to take with him on which he will erect an altar to worship the Lord. The remarkable faith of this foreigner sets the stage for the faithfilled Samaritan of the Gospel.

Elisha's refusal of gifts for his service reflects no rancour, but his awareness that he did only what God required. Any reward will come from the Lord. Both men are examples of faith lived and spoken with conviction.
