For the 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time:

Today's First Reading and the Gospel both focus on the shared humanity of man and woman, and the biblical view that God intends husband and wife to become so united that they may be considered as a single unit.

In the today's Gospel Jesus is asked a much debated at the time question: may a man divorce his wife? At this point in Jewish history, some Jews accepted oral Law, adaptations of written Law that had developed in various life contexts. Others accepted as authentic only what appeared in the written Law of the Pentateuch. Hence while it was true that Mosaic Law permitted divorce, views of acceptable grounds for divorce varied considerably. Any response of Jesus would draw the ire of some interpreters of Moses (women were not allowed to initiate a divorce).

Jesus roots his fundamental response not in Moses, but in creation itself. He quotes today's First Reading, pointing out that God's intent seems to be that husband and wife form a bond such that they become like a single living being, "one flesh," not a loose linkage of easily separated parts. Seeing that Jesus reaches beyond interpretation of Moses to the Creator's purposes for humankind, the Pharisee makes no response. The disciples, however, continue to question. Jesus in effect repeats his response, adding an important derail that would likely have caused them further puzzlement. He states that either a man or woman who divorces a marriage partner "commits adultery." With this teaching, Jesus treats man and woman in marriage as equals, with equal duties and rights. This indirectly reinforces his essential point: in the marital union, the partners are meant to create such oneness that they become an unbreakable unit.
