In today's 2<sup>nd</sup> reading James presents more of his concrete, no-nonsense ethical teaching. He insists that a Christian cannot simply talk about care for other members in the community, or give verbal assurance to those community members who have physical needs; one must act in imitation of Jesus.

But James seems to have another important point to make. Many biblical scholars view this passage as James' caution against misunderstanding one of the teachings of Paul. As is well known, the latter repeatedly insisted to fellow Jews that they were not saved by conformity to works of the Law of Moses, but by faith in God's free gift of new life through Christ (grace). It seems possible, if not probable, that some had misunderstood or misapplied Paul's emphasis on faith and behaved as if a claim of belief in Christ would, in itself, lead to salvation. James exposes such an assumption as false, insisting that faith must take concrete form in how one in fact treats others in need. A brother or sister lacking food or clothing cannot be helped by anyone's mere claim of faith; believers must act, quickly and concretely, to alleviate another's need.

The ushers are very kind and come downstairs to inform the group when it is time to come back upstairs. Prior to beginning this Ministry, Kelly

will go over the resource materials and guide one in how to prepare for leading these sessions.
