MAY 30 2021 Most Holy Trinity

CYCLE B (MARK)

Family of Love: Scott Hahn Reflects on the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity

Readings: Deuteronomy 4:32–34, 39–40 Psalm 33:4–6, 9, 18–20, 22 Romans 8:14–17 Matthew 28:16–20

Last Sunday, we celebrated the sending of the Spirit, which sealed God's new covenant and made a new creation. In this new creation, we live in the family of God, who has revealed himself as a Trinity of love. We share in His divine nature through His Body



and Blood (see <u>2 Peter 1:4</u>). This is the meaning of the three feasts that cap the Easter season— Pentecost, Trinity Sunday, and Corpus Christi. These feasts should be intimate reminders of how deeply God loves us, how He chose us, from before the foundation of the world, to be His children (see Ephesians 1:4-5). Today's readings illuminate how all God's words and works were meant to prepare for the revelation of the Trinity and God's blessing in Jesus Christ-the blessing we inherited in Baptism, and renew in each Eucharist. By God's word the heavens and earth were filled with His kindness, we sing in today's Psalm. Out of love, God called Abraham and chose his descendants to be His own people, Moses says in today's First Reading (see <u>Deuteronomy 4:20,37</u>). Through the Israelites, He revealed to the nations that He alone is Lord and there is no other. In Jesus, God's word took flesh as a son of Abraham (see Matthew 1:1). And Jesus reveals in the Gospel today that the one God is Father, Son, and Spirit, and that He desires to make all people His own. As He led Israel out of Egypt, God freed us from slavery, Paul says in today's Epistle. As He adopted Israel (see <u>Romans 9:4</u>), He gives us the Spirit by which we can know Him as "Our Father." As God's heirs, we receive the commissions of Moses and Jesus today. We are to fix our hearts on Him, and to observe all that He has commanded. The Eucharist is His pledge-that He will be with us until the end, that He will deliver us from death to live forever in the promised land of His kingdom.

Province of Ontario's Pandemic "Roadmap to Reopen"

The Province of Ontario announced a three step approach that will be implemented throughout Ontario, subject to declining Covid-19 numbers.

Step 1: "Roadmap to Reopen" will come into effect on June 14. Each step will last a minimum of 21 days. In Step 1 indoor gatherings at places of worship remains the same at 10 people.

Step 2: first week of July at the earliest - places of worship will be permitted 15% capacity.

Step 3: at least 21 days following the start of Step 2 - places of worship will be permitted "larger indoor services or ceremonies.

SAINT BONIFACE

Monday June 5th is the Feast of Saint Boniface

St. Boniface was born circa 675 in what is today known as the county of Devon, England. He studied in English monasteries before traveling to Europe, where he converted pagan peoples in present-day Germany and the Netherlands. In his role as a bishop and archbishop, he also worked on church reforms. After returning to missionary work, Boniface was killed by pagan tribespeople in Frisia on June 5, 754, at the approximate age of 80.

A reminder that the collection dates for the 2021 campaign have shifted to the weekends of June 19-20 and October 2-3.


