

SHARE LIFE SUNDAY

At the age of Twelve Jesus entered

ShareLife the Temple as was his custom and read this Passage of Scripture from the Prophet Isaiah (61:1-2)

The Spirit of the Lord has been given to me for he has anointed me. He has sent me to bring good news to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives and to the blind new sight, to set the down trodden free, to proclaim the Lord's year of favour.

Your contribution to Share life fulfills that passage of Scripture. Share Life helps 42 agencies one of which is Covenant House which helps homeless youth. It is estimated that there are over 2,000 homeless youth in Toronto on any given night. 50 percent of homeless youth come from middle and upper income families. About 32 percent of youth at Covenant House report that they are struggling with mental issues. Homeless youth are up to 40 times more likely to die young than their peers.

According to a Canadian National Study. Suicide and drug overdose are leading causes.

THE WAY OF THE CROSS

The Way of the Cross, or Stations of the Cross, is a Catholic devotion that originated in the journey of pilgrims to Jerusalem where they would retrace the steps of Jesus during his passion. Franciscan originally encouraged this devotion, which became popular in the fifteenth century. The focus for the devotional practice consists of fourteen stations

that can be as simple as a cross or as elaborate as wood, marble, or other artistic renditions of various aspects of the passion of Jesus. Stations of the Cross at the Basilica Friday evenings at 7:00pm come journey with Jesus on the Way of the Cross.
