

Why is this Easter Different?

Every Easter is different... not because we are celebrating anything other than Christ's resurrection, but each Easter provides us with a new chance to open our hearts wide to take in the Good News!

This is the Easter when...

The breath of Christ's peace got past my objections.

I saw new life in those around me.

I realized I have a real vocation to serve the Good News.

The promise of life with God lit up my heart.

I let God heal my most troubling wounds.

I awoke to the joy of the responsibility to make Christ known.

I joined myself to the healing and mercy of Christ for the sake of others.

The disciples of Jesus also experienced the same kind of challenge... to hear Christ revealing Himself and to latch on to the implications of what that means. They were attracted and
