The Twelve Days of Christmas

Surprisingly, as Christians we are out of step with the societal observance of the season. By now all mention of Christmas will have been stopped on radio, TV and other media. And this year we were treated to a compressed Advent of only a shade over three weeks because Christmas fell on a Monday. Yet, it is now that we are in the midst of the Christmas season.

A number of feasts occur to underline the point. This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family and the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God. On December 28th we observed the memorial of the Holy Innocents, the children martyred by Herod. On a side note, the Art Gallery of Ontario has a very well-known portrayal of this event by the artist, Peter Paul Reubens.

The Solemnity of Mary the Mother of God is the grand celebration of God taking on our human condition, coming to us in flesh.

She is the Mother of the Saviour and therefore our mother in our new life in Christ. By now, some of the comings and goings of Christmas are in the past and hopefully you have time to rest a little. Christ's birth cemented our belonging to God, as St. Paul proclaims in his letter to the Romans, "nothing can separate us from the love of Christ". In Mary we have a loving and attentive mother who understands the tiniest details of our needs. Take a little time to breathe this truth in!


On the Feast of the Holy Family our meditation extends to St. Joseph and how the three formed a family of new birth for us. Not knowing much about Joseph's life leaves us free to accept that he is close to us. As patron saint of the Church everywhere in the world, it is Joseph who completes a kind of earthly trinity that is taken up in the Holy Trinity because the Son has become one of us.

Next weekend we will celebrate the revelation of Christ in the Solemnity of the Epiphany, literally, "the showing". As the wise men came with gifts for the Christ child, it has been a tradition in many countries to exchange gifts on this feast. Giving someone a gift in this spirit asserts that they are another Christ. Again, we can think of St. Paul who repeats over and over that we are new and living in Christ. Insofar as we desire to do God's will, we reflect that indwelling of the Saviour. Even if we don't always reflect it, Jesus never abandons us. He is always keeping us with Him. All we can do is just try to have the biggest heart we can to say, "Yes".

May you drink in the full joy of our salvation this Christmas season.
