# **Meeting a Turbulent World**

With a world that is so connected we have become much more aware of problems and conflicts, even those physically far away, though many are close. We can easily become overwhelmed. We might well ask ourselves what is to be done ... and find very little of the answers.

If we are at all sensitive and have had the good fortune not to be subject to serious adversity, we know that real suffering is only a generation or two away in most of our families. Naturally, we want to avoid it. And, if we ourselves have suffered we want to avoid it even more so.

The last few weeks the readings have been suggesting to us a much different starting point. St. Paul has been reminding his people that they have been made new in Christ. It is this new creation that must capture them and change them.

It is even possible that our Christian life will help us to see hope where others find discouragement. If we live at the level of our flesh, only in this visible realm of ours, we will observe that we decay, we wear out, we are far less than perfect. We often insist on our own way or the rightness of our own opinions. Certainly, if this is all there is to be said, a world of conflict should not surprise us. Nor are we Pollyannas who see the world naïvely.

Choosing to be blind to the problems that beset us and our world, would court disaster. Similarly, thinking that "everything will work out" somehow automatically without our involvement, we become part of the indifference that will deprive us, and others, of the good gifts we are meant to use for the glory of God and the love of neighbour.

So, St. Paul reminds his hearers that they have been changed. They have begun the new life which the Father's only Son gives. In the Church, we have a variety of aids available to help us to put that into practice. We have the rich life of religious communities, the many writings of the saints, the shared devotional practices of the Rosary and Eucharistic Adoration, the broad and deep intellectual traditions that will help apply new ways of living and the myriad of quiet virtues practiced among us already. Are these fruitful things not more important than the troubles around us? Christ is the doctor who truly heals us.

When confronted with conflict in the face of His proclamation, Jesus did not refer to arguments in his favour or stoke the fires. He gave Himself for us. It was a very hard thing; He would have preferred the cup to pass rather than to accept it. In a world of comfort, we also need to accept the goodness of pouring out our lives, with the knowledge that it will not always be easy, but, that the resurrected life and the renewal of creation have begun already. In the midst of a turbulent world, we need to remember who we are and where life is to be found.


St. Paul's EDGE ministry will run on the first and third Friday evenings of each month, from 6 pm to 8 pm.




