

We seek glory because it is our human nature to do so. Self-seeking glory is all around us. God challenges us to recognize that God-in-us will lead to great things. God in our small, weak selves leads to holiness, a different glory. And though our culture shapes us, we shape our culture; the culture changes only when God shapes us. When Jesus taught The Beatitudes, he was challenging the culture too.

FEAST SAINT BLAISE FEBRUARY 3

Blaise is best known for the tradition of blessing throats. An Armenian bishop, Blaise suffered martyrdom during the persecution of Licinius in early 4th century. Little is known about him, it is said religious oppression forced him to live as a hermit in a cave. Legend said Blaise performed a miraculous cure on a boy who was choking to death and is long associated with cures for afflictions of the throat.
