The Miracles of Revelation

90 - 1

When I was very young, maybe 4 or 5, my dad would sit at the end of the bed and we would discuss which story might be read that night to help me go to sleep. Sometimes I would say to my dad, "Tell me the story of you!" I loved to listen to his description of even the simplest of things. I remember him describing milk delivered by horse and cart. In a time of airplanes and spaceships that seemed like a fantasy world of another kind. I suppose that's how we look at life "pre-internet" or "pre-cellphone" now too. It was like some kind of veil was being lifted on the mystery of life itself. All these things happened before I was around.

Of course, behind all that was also a desire to know another real and very deep story. The story of me!

And what is the reason for the telling of stories? I think it is because of our longing to be connected, to belong. This is how we know who we are. And it goes back to that sense of our own "beginning".

The relating of the Epiphany is that kind of story. It goes to our beginnings, literally a birth into a new life that is no longer corruptible. The star is a light. It broadcasts this new birth. And just as when we were young, we begin to perceive it as we draw nearer to it. As the words reach a little deeper into us each time we hear the story of the journey of the Magi, it reveals the truth of God's closeness to us and our belonging to God.

Mary and Joseph must truly have wondered what all this meant. The Magi's homage must have been very unexpected. What was it like for them as the truth of God the Father's love came more clearly into their souls? What is it like for us when we awaken to the love of God? In moments of prayer? In others? Even in ourselves? How miraculous it is to recognize the sacredness that is ours! It makes us humble, grateful and happy.

We are at the beginning of a new calendar year. I hope that the Christmas season has been a time of deep renewal for each of you. As we welcome Christ each day, may His peace always be with us.
