❖ A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

The Heart of Ministry

I hope you are or will be enjoying a time of rest and renewal during these precious summer months. Perhaps it's a good time to reflect on a few themes central to our life together in the parish.

1. Ministry is a good in and of itself.

Many years ago, I was working with a group of altar servers at the parish to which I was assigned. I asked them why they served on the altar. I figured that they were giving me really theological answers because they thought that was what I wanted to hear - we serve to show our love for God etc. Of course, that's absolutely true and central, but truthfully, we don't always feel that way. I suggested to them the simple answer that we serve because it is good to serve. I still feel that is a good answer because it leaves room for God to reveal to us over time something of the beauty and mystery of the real answer. I can content myself that I am putting the Lord's work through my hands without needing to question when those same hands feel tired. As St. Paul tells us so often, it is the Lord who works in us; we don't have to constantly evaluate it. Exercising ministry is a good in and of itself and, no doubt, that goodness will be revealed to us in all kinds of unexpected ways.

2. Springing from the Eucharist.

The place to start building up our life together is certainly the Eucharist itself. Take time to notice its fruits. What is in your heart as you come to Mass? Is God



perhaps suggesting many other things that you haven't seen on the horizon yet? Where are your consolations? When? Are they outward moving? What about your worries? How is the Lord gradually helping you to become separated from them? Have you heard of the blessings the Lord has given you through the words or actions of others? At the Eucharist all the events and people of our lives are brought together in the redeeming love of Jesus.

3. Come Holy Spirit - enkindle in us the Fire of Your Love!

Often, we think the mold has been set in our lives. That can prevent us from seeing the beauty of the gifts we have

received. Speaking for myself, I find it is my friends who nudge and cajole me to become more awake to these things. The Spirit knits together our experiences and efforts to faithfully follow Jesus and

others to raise them up in ourselves.

Sit with these thoughts. Pray. Talk about it and consider the possibility of how the Spirit may be calling you to give yourself in a simple and very doable way here at the parish and in the relationships that compose your life.

I hope to give a talk in the fall to share with you some of the fruits of my recent trip to Rome to attend a conference on healthcare and ecology. One takeaway, I can tell you, is the strong sense of the interrelatedness we have with the creation around us on this earth. At the parish we are part of a graced ecology as well.


