

❖ A Message from the Pastor



Sacrifice in a World of Comfort

Jesus says: "I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full." (John 10:10) We might well ask why there is still suffering in the world. It comes in many forms. Some of it we can trace to the actions of others. Some we can see as consequences of our own decisions in the past. Some comes from the nature of our bodies, prone to decay. And some, we just can't trace.

In different cultures over the centuries there have been different responses. Some of the Romans, in Jesus' time, for example, would have been Stoics, seeing suffering as something to be endured; expected but not to be dominated by. Our modern society seeks to eliminate suffering, often through scientific research and economic prosperity. And what do we find? Well, quite often, we are not somehow satisfied. Perhaps, we have not come to terms with this dimension of life. Especially when we love, we are prone to disappointment and sufferings of the heart. The music industry certainly knows this.

Jesus gives us Himself, laying down His life, as He explains, not only for His friends but for anyone who wishes to accept Him. Sacrifice; it's a very countercultural word which much of the world sees no value in. While some might accept that personal sacrifices, to achieve some goal might be worthwhile, the idea that it could simply be good for us to sacrifice seems foreign.

Jesus tells us that to sacrifice out of love is of supreme good. Even this path, however, has to be approached prudently. We may be so desperate inside of us that we sacrifice the very things that God wishes us to use. Cutting off the gifts we have, or our emotional intelligence, can simply leave us crippled and our actions can become a way of avoiding life rather than being truly giving.

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. Jesus has given Himself to us so that we are nurished to live generous and full lives. We can find happiness, therefore, in sharing all the joys and consolations we get in this life, and equally in the challenges and even tribulations that come our way. This is not to be indifferent to suffering, but to join ourselves to Jesus' own journey, bringing about the Kingdom of God. It also helps if we take time to make even small sacrifices for one another.

As you leave Mass today, ask the Lord Jesus who has given Himself to you, to help you rise to the challenge of allowing Him to touch all the dimensions of life. Peace be with you!
