
Please contact us for more information on preparing for and receiving a Sacrament at St. Paul's Basilica.

ShareLife

As Catholics we can take for granted the very natural way we reach across space and time in this world to help one another. While we hear charities appeal to people's sense of care, for us this is something very natural. It is part of the reason we are here worshiping together.

I was in high school when Archbishop Philip Pocock withdrew our Catholic agencies from the wide civic fundraising effort called the United Way. He did so because of our respect for life. Since then, ShareLife has represented the fact that Christ's care for every person from the first moment until natural death is made present through the cooperation of so many of us. We have people who work at our Catholic agencies responding to family life needs, the special needs of immigrants and refugees, children and young parents. Our seminary recently received permission from the Holy See to grant pontifical theological degrees enhancing the service it can provide to the Church not just in Toronto but beyond. Youth ministry efforts are laying foundations for deeper living of faith and renewal of ministry. The Pastoral Mission Fund provides dioceses and religious communities around the world the opportunity to fund projects that will help deepen the presence of the Church and the proclamation of the Gospel. The work of Development and Peace helps with projects that raise the living conditions of people much in need of support. In other words, ShareLife has very broad shoulders and lets us be present to so many others.

It is an asset of inestimable value that we have the privilege of working together in this way. Far from being something we take for granted let us treasure and support it so that we can be a sign together of the genuine care of the Church. People will see something of Christ as we do it.
