

The Way of the Cross or Stations of the Cross is a Catholic devotion that originated in the journey of pilgrims to Jerusalem where they would retrace the steps of Jesus during his passion. Franciscans originally encouraged this devotion, which became popular in the fifteenth century. The focus for the devotional practice consists of fourteen stations that can be as simple as a cross or as elaborate as wood, marble, or other artistic renditions of various aspects of the passion. Specific prayers are recited before each station as the participants meditate on that aspect of the passion of Jesus

There are normally three pillars of Lenten observance. There is prayer, fasting and alms giving. As part of our alms giving at St. Paul's Basilica, we are having a clothing drive for Covenant House, which is a twelve minute car drive from our church. Covenant House in Toronto opened in 1982. It is Canada's largest youth shelter serving young people between the ages of 16 to 24.

#### Did you know?

At any time during the year as many as 40,000 youth in Canada are without a place to call home.

An estimated 70% of homeless youth have fled or been forced out of homes where there is abuse or neglect.

Canadian street kids are up to 40 times more likely to die young than their peers.

The retreat will include Reliquary of the Martyrs exposed in the Church, individual blessings with the relics, celebration of Mass, Reconciliation service on one of the nights, and each evening, a reflection on the self-sacrifice of the Canadian Martyrs, weaved into the passion narratives of Jesus Christ, a very powerful and really practical help for daily prayer. Let the lives of the Martyrs deepen your relationship with Christ as we journey with them during the Lenten season.

#### SIGN-UP SUNDAY! March 3/4 We Need Your Help!

Cardinal Collins and bishops across Ontario are asking for an email address from every Catholic family in their community, with a goal of 100,000 email addresses collected by the end of February 2018. This information will be used locally by Cardinal Collins and trusted faith partners to communicate periodically (approximately 6-8 times each year) on issues of particular importance for the Catholic community.

The first campaign of 2018 is the Call for Conscience, inviting our elected Members of Provincial Parliament (MPPs) and those seeking office this June to increase funding/access to palliative care, to protect health care workers wishing to abstain from any involvement in euthanasia/assisted suicide and to protect faithbased facilities from participation in euthanasia/assisted suicide. The work builds on a similar campaign in 2017.


