***** A Message from the Pastor



First Holy Communion

This weekend, at our 11am Mass, we are welcoming some of our children who will receive Holy Communion for the first time. They bring with them their hopes, joys and questions about life.

Jesus lives among us. Fed with Jesus, we are sent out not only to proclaim Christ, but try to let Christ shine! What could bring us more joy than seeing this vital gift grow through the Holy Spirit?

It has only been in the last 100 years or so that young children have been receiving Holy Communion. This step used to take place at an older age. The Holy Father of the time, Pope St. Pius X, desired that the gift of the sacrament be available as early as a child's faith and reason made possible.

Young people can show us so much about what it is to have faith, to trust, and give and not count the cost. The lives of young people can benefit so much from the nourishment of Holy Communion. As adults we can forget to be energized by Jesus' presence in the Eucharist. Maybe we are looking to be comforted instead of being roused. Regaining a keen sense of joy and fulfillment helps us find peace ourselves.

Let us not think only of the innocence of children. While learning still so much about life, they often carry unseen burdens. Communion is as necessary for them as it is for anyone. And they should know that we pray also for them and for their needs. When we reflect on Holy Communion, we think of Mary whose month it is. If I want to know what Communion is, then I look to Mary whose closeness to Jesus is so real and direct. She embodies communion with God, which means she is also so close to us.

As we receive Communion this week and every week may we contemplate the closeness of Jesus to all of us, welcoming Him, thanking Him and asking Him to help us to welcome more people in knowing Him.


