#### **A Message from the Pastor**

#### A Little Background Ahead of Archbishop Leo's First Visit to Our Parish



I'd like to look at two areas that might help prepare the soil for our new Archbishop's visit to the parish: a little about his own background, and a little about what it is to be the Archbishop of Toronto.

While most of our bishops have some graduate study of theology or a related area in their background, Archbishop Leo has a varied set of experiences. He comes from Montreal and as you may have gathered from a family with Italian heritage. He grew up with three languages, Italian, French and English. His journey to the priestly life followed right after school. After ordination, he served in several parishes. The coming together of his pastoral life, spiritual life, and able mind, resulted in his being invited to study in Rome where he attended the institution that prepares diplomats for the Vatican. Along the way, and during his time in Rome, he accumulated graduate studies in canon law, theology, international law, spiritual direction and his special love the area of theology concerned with Mary.

He worked in several embassies of the Holy See around the world before he returned to Montreal and worked in formation at the diocesan seminary, helping to prepare men for priestly ordination. Following that he worked for the national conference of bishops in Canada, and finally as the chief administrative official for the Archdiocese of Montreal. In the fall of 2022, he was ordained as auxiliary bishop for the Archdiocese of Montreal and in February of 2023 he was named our new Archbishop here in Toronto. Despite his apparent ease in elevated matters, I am sure you will see the heart of the priest and pastor only grew in the years since he had served in a parish.

Now, especially as we think about the challenges facing the Church, I would like to paint a bit of a picture. There are the general stats for our archdiocese that make it clear that to be its leader is not easy. We have 225 parishes, 250 lay movements and organizations, a large number of religious orders and societies of apostolic life, and something approaching 2 million Catholics. provide the services, guidance, and the necessary working relationships for all that, we have only about 150 employees working at the Archdiocese Chancery Office. I know when I was in the Lay Ministry Office, we estimated volunteers across the Archdiocese to be about Overall, despite the outside 30,000. view that the Church is a materially rich monolithic organization, the truth is

we try to do a lot with a little. That is certainly the nature of our parishes, but also of our diocesan offices. The way we become effective is by working together. This gives us the connective tissue, if you like, that makes our Christian living more fruitful. Our tendency in society is to lay upon the shoulders of those in authority the expectation that they can solve problems for us, without realizing that we all have some part to play. As we wrestle with trust it is the responsibility of each of us to give others reason to trust that it is possible to do the good we desire, with God's help. While the Church needs to address all kinds of areas of its life, these things will not happen positively without us. Every pastor hopes and prays that the people who make up the community will be able to work together for good. As Archbishop Leo comes to us at the beginning of his ministry here in Toronto, let's encourage him by showing we are ready to work with him to make Christ's creative and redeeming love real throughout our community.


