

28th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Wedding feasts are celebrations of joy. The one in today's Gospel, however, turns ugly. The guests refuse to attend; they attack the king's slaves. The king retaliates with murder and destruction. But the feast must go ahead. Just when things seem to be improving, the king notices a man without a wedding robe and casts him out into the darkness.

This parable is scary and makes me squirm. I recognize myself in those who ignored the king's invitation and in the man wearing the wrong outfit. The parable challenges us to critique our friendship with God. God desires our friendship, inviting us time and time again into relationship. We sometimes fail in our response. Like those who rejected the invitation, we get busy with our own agendas; we ignore God. Or, like the man who shows up improperly attired, we have the wrong attitude. We may be smug, indifferent or insincere. We cast ourselves into the darkness when we refuse God's offer of friendship.

The Mass is a transitional time between the present and eternity. It is God's standing invitation to enter more deeply into relationship with God and others. Our presence here expresses our willingness to put on the robe of Christ so that we may stand confidently and joyfully in the light of God's friendship.


The Order of St. Lazarus St. Paul's Basilica – October 15th, 2017 @ 11 a.m. mass

The Military and Hospitaller Order of Saint Lazarus of Jerusalem is an international order of chivalry whose beginnings go back more than 900 years.

When Jerusalem fell to the warriors of the First Crusade in 1099, the victors found the city filled with the sick and wounded. A French monk, the Blessed Brother Gerard, undertook the huge task of caring for them in the small Christian hospital of Saint John of Jerusalem near the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. However, those who were afflicted with leprosy were forbidden by law to enter the city and had to take refuge in an ancient leper hospice outside Jerusalem's north gate. This hospice was founded by St. Basil in the 4th Century and served by Armenian monks. Brother Gerard devoted himself to its reorganization and administration.

The Order in Canada, with a membership of approximately 600, is a bilingual, multi-denominational Christian, charitable organization whose goals are to: * support and expand palliative care * alleviate the suffering of persons with leprosy

- * care for the aged, sick and needy
- * support medical research
- * promote ecumenism
- * promote the qualities of good citizenship
