#### The Sound in St. Paul's Church A Cross We Share Together

If there is one complaint that is elicited by St. Paul's it is poor sound in the church. Let us start with the obvious; the church was not built with a sound system in mind. The acoustics are actually exceptional when there is no electronic enhancement. That is why so many choirs and other performers approach us to use the church. There have been those who have commented recently that they thought the sound has deteriorated. What had actually happened is the speakers for the back half of the church were turned off, so the folks expressing that concern were right. We have recently had people who are experts in sound visit the church and say our sound system is fine and the equipment up to standard, rather it is the acoustics with an electronic sound system which is the problem, particularly the vaulted ceiling and the rounded apse. They said that these problems could be solved significantly by hanging baffles from the ceiling and covering the pillars with fabric. Let me assure you we will not be doing either of these things. They have suggested having the least mic's as possible on at one time. We are working with this. Also we are experimenting with not using mics with the 11:00 choir and that has helped. We will be trying other things as we go along.

Part of the problem is solved by speaking slowly, because what happens is the sound all mushes together coming from the various speakers. Our readers, to a person, are actually quite good and pace themselves well.

The sound technicians said the best thing we could do for the sound is fill the church with people so that they would absorb the sound. They suspect that sound is better in the winter when folks are wearing more absorbent clothes. There is one obvious solution and I hope I do not sound too facetious, if you are having a hard time hearing, then sit closer to the front, the sound is much better at the front than farther back.


