A Message from the Pastor

The Beatitudes: The Good Shepherd in Our Midst

In the Beatitudes Jesus turns our world upside down. The meek will inherit the earth. Those who remain poor in spirit and rely on God and not themselves will be happy. It is not the strong and self-reliant who are representative of the life of God's Kingdom. The 200-year story of St. Paul's parish includes many parishioners who have had difficult and challenging lives. The meek have always been here.

This weekend our friends at the Good Shepherd Centre are celebrating 60 years of service to men in need in this city. Christ the Good Shepherd carries the lost and weakened sheep on his shoulders safely home to pasture.

There are many reasons why people find themselves without housing. The cause and the effect is often alienation of relationships. For those with some kinds of mental health challenges the first need is to recognize that something is truly in need of repair. Many have struggled with addiction which often is a coping tool to deal with emotional hurt that has never



been given the circumstances in which healing can take place. And once people are addicted all kinds of other things follow. Health problems may be serious and the fact that drugs affect cognition, the judgement needed to get on and stay on a path to healing may be obstructed.

Today, the Good Shepherd has some 95 people working together not only to relieve symptoms but accompany people on getting to and repairing the sources of their challenges. We are all aware of what a critical issue housing is becoming with it being too expensive even for well

employed couples to afford. It would be great to say that the supply of those in need of the Good Shepherd is going down, but the opposite seems to be true. In the new digital age these marginalized people are being pushed further away from gaining the tools to be effective participants in the society in which they live.

It is one thing to say we would all love to see solutions to this wound in our society, but it is because of those who work every day at the Good Shepherd that our words can have some credibility. Many many people have received that lift that they needed to recover stability and lives of meaningful relationship. Christ was not afraid to be present to those on the margins nor shy about telling us that the last shall be first. May Christ the Good Shepherd make fruitful the care provided by all those who serve this important ministry in our city and our Archdiocese.

Thanksgiving Food Drive

Celebration of the Solemnity of St. Michael & Conferral of the Pallium upon the Most Rev. Francis Leo

On September 29th at 5:30 pm, in celebration of the Archdiocese of Toronto's patron, St. Michael's feast day, Archbishop Francis Leo will celebrate Mass at St. Michael's Cathedral Basilica, including music from the world-renowned St. Michael's Choir School. As part of the celebration, the Apostolic Nuncio to Canada, the Most Rev. Ivan Jurkovič, will confer the pallium on our archbishop, a symbol of his role as Metropolitan Archbishop of Toronto and shepherd to the faithful. Following Mass, there will be an informal reception with light refreshments in the St. Michael's Cathedral atrium and courtyard. Seating will be first come, first served. All are welcome to join in this special celebration for our archdiocese and archbishop! Due to the timing of this Mass, our parish Mass on September 29th will take place at 12:15 pm rather than the usual 5 pm.

The 109th World Day of Migrants and Refugees ('WDoMaR') Sunday, September 24, 2023

His Holiness Pope Francis announced this year's WDoMaR theme as "Free to Choose Whether to Migrate or to Stay." Pope Francis acknowledges that while the decision to migrate should always be free, in many cases it is not. This point was reflected by St. John Paul II in his 90th WDoMaR message in which he wrote, "building conditions of peace means in practice being seriously committed to safeguarding first of all the right not to emigrate, that

is, the right to live in peace and dignity in one's own country." Pope Francis quoted the words of the Lord, "...I was a stranger, and you welcomed me" reminding us that the Lord's words are a "constant admonition to see in the migrant not simply a brother or sister in difficulty, but Christ himself, who knocks at our door."
