

25th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today's readings raise a difficult question: is it possible for one who enjoys a life of privilege to be a true Christian? I am reminded of the uncomfortable image of the camel trying to pass through the eye of the needle. Are good intentions enough?

Amos and Paul offer some valuable clues. The first reading sternly warns the rich and powerful against cheating and taking advantage of the poor in the pursuit of profit. The second reading reminds us that "kings and all who are in high positions" need our prayerful support in order to carry out their responsibilities to promote peace and dignity for all.

The psalm, however, draws us deeper. We are told, "The Lord raises the poor from the dust...to make them sit with the princes." In other words. God erases the artificial distinction between rich and poor, between the powerful and the needy. For the Christian, there can be no "us" and "them." "There is one God," says Paul, and so we are all members of the same family, the same body. As we work to promote justice, peace and equality in our world, we are called to embrace each person as our sister or brother.
