The Vine and the Branches

Today we reflect upon the last "I am" declaration of Jesus in the Gospel according to John. Addressing His disciples, He said: "I am the true vine and you are the branches". This analogy symbolizes our deep dependence on Him for we, the branches, can only bear fruit if we remain united to Him, the Vine.

Although the Gospel presents the sad destiny of those branches that break their communion with the Vine – they will wither and be thrown into the fire – Jesus spoke these words at the last Supper to encourage His disciples to endure any trial and be faithful to Him. Shortly before this statement, Judas had left the table to betray the Lord and Jesus himself had revealed that His passion was at hand. Now Jesus wanted His friends, not only those eleven, but those of all time, to know that He was not going to desert them, even though they would no longer enjoy His physical presence.

Besides, as the branches keep connected to the trunk they are assured of nourishment. Branches cannot survive on their own. It is the trunk that gives energy and the possibility of bearing fruit. This truth makes us think about those plans and endeavors that do not work out. Perhaps the reason is that we try to accomplish them by ourselves and do not rely on God as branches on the Vine. Once again, we are reminded that without Jesus we can do nothing. He is the source of wisdom for our choices, strength for our projects and life for our dreams. Let's renew our commitment of union with the Vine and bear much fruit for God's glory and the good of all. Fr. Willyans SCJ
