#### **Compassion in Action**

In today's Gospel Jesus shows compassion (in action) towards a man with leprosy. As in many other occasions, the Lord was approached by someone who had been marginalized because of his infirmity. The leper was considered impure and had to observe very rigid rules. According to the Ancient Law described in the First Reading, he should cry out: "Unclean, unclean" if anyone was approaching him. He was obligated to live alone and distant from healthy people. Despite all prohibitions, this very man chooses to approach Jesus and cry out for mercy, "If you choose, you can make me clean."

The Gospel says that Jesus was "moved with pity" and stretching his hands, touched and cured him. The Lord is never indifferent to those who suffer, no matter what kind of suffering it might be. His mercy is not impotent; rather, it is revealed through a movement of love towards the leper. Jesus Himself could be considered impure by touching a man with leprosy. Nevertheless, He said, "I do choose!" He accepted the risk in order to alleviate his sorrows and give him dignity.

In our days we may find people who are facing social, financial or even religious exclusion as this leper did. Following Jesus' example, we are called to look at everyone who has been discriminated against and show them mercy in action. We are called to go beyond a mere feeling of pity. We are called to take the risk and to do whatever we can to alleviate their crosses. It is easy to give little alms and to say, "I will pray for you", just to get rid of someone who is annoying. Being compassionate, though, means something more profound. Today the Gospel challenges us to show compassion in action; to give some of our time, our attention, our smile and our love to those who come to us.
