True Happiness

The Gospel this weekend may be confusing because the values that Jesus brings up are totally different in our society. Our society believes that true happiness results from having material things: money, a career, a good husband or wife, a beautiful house, a nice car and so on. But Jesus proclaims that those who are poor, hungry, weeping or persecuted are called blessed. Equally, we are confused with His words of rebuke and punishment for those who are rich, enjoying life and a good reputation. This is, indeed, a Gospel of reversals

So, what does Jesus want to tell us with this teaching? Jesus wants us to realize that we cannot depend on the values of our current society as the source of eternal happiness. They not only fail to deliver on their promise, but our misplaced trust in them will lead to our demise. The ultimate danger is in misidentifying the source of our eternal happiness.

These teaching are often described as a framework for Christian living. Our vocation as Christians is not to be first in this world, but rather to be first in the eyes of God. We are challenged to examine our present situation in the context of our ultimate horizon, the Kingdom of God.

So, our reflection is: are we guided by the framework for Christian living in achieving a true and lasting happiness? What motivates us in life? Is it only worldly riches or heavenly riches, too? *Fr. Aegidius SCJ*
