Unconditional Love

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus teaches us a lesson about how we ought to treat our enemies. When we think about our enemies, what comes to mind are those who bully us, those who do bad things to us and those who persecute us for no reason. And for some reason, we cannot retaliate. As a result, resentment, anger, bitterness and hatred begin to build up in us and it culminates with the most painful vengeance. But would that be the best revenge?

Today Jesus teaches us: "love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you." With this, Jesus teaches us to be forgiving people. He teaches us to ask for forgiveness from those we have wounded and to forgive those who have wounded us. This is our call today as followers of Christ: "Pardon and you will be pardoned – forgive and you will be forgiven".

To be sure, it is a very difficult teaching to follow. Yet, that difficult teaching comes with a promise from the Lord, that He will be our refuge and protector, He will save us from those who bully us, who hate us, who curse us. Yes, the Lord will save us just as He saved David.

So, our reflection is: is there someone we need to ask for forgiveness today for some wound we inflicted? Is there someone we need to forgive today for something they did to us? What causes us to have difficulty to do what Jesus taught us about forgiveness and loving unconditionally?

Lives of the Saints

Saint Peter Damian - feast day February 21

Saint Peter Damian is a Doctor of the Church, so honoured for his writings, as well as his work for reform and renewal of the Church. Peter was born in 1007 into a large family in Ravenna, Italy. He was orphaned at a very young age, and the first brother to care for him treated him very badly. Another brother, however, a priest in Ravenna, recognized Peter's brilliance and arranged for schooling. Peter appreciated this so much that he took on his brother's name and called himself Peter Damian. He became a hermit monk and was eventually chosen as the superior of his community. In 1057 he was appointed the bishop of Ostia. Throughout his live he fought for clerical reform and against the laxness and immorality of the clergy of his day. Eventually, he received permission from Pope Alexander to return to the simple life of a monk. He died in 1072.
