A Meditation

Religious Devotion



Devotion properly understood means a deep personal surrender to God in thanksgiving and repentance. In this sense devotion is a response to the

command to love the Lord with all our heart, soul, strength, and mind (Lk 10:27). In recent decades the word *devotion* has taken on a pejorative meaning among some Christians. It has been seen as a purely emotional or subjective phenomenon related to histrionic or emotionally dependent personalities. Indeed, we do occasionally meet such people in the Gospels—Mary of Magdala seems to be one. It is worth noting that Christ treats these souls with compassion and responds to their devotion in a gracious and accepting way.

Devotion, however, should not be restricted to highly emotional kinds of people. Persons of great intelligence and ability, often illustrious preachers and theologians like John Wesley and Cardinal Newman, are capable of deep devotion. It may well be that what is needed in contemporary Christianity is a sincere devotion to Christ expressed in many ways for many different kinds of people... Religion without devotion is a very dry piece of toast indeed.
