Urgent Time of Conversion

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us the parable of the fig tree which should have borne fruit but after three years was still barren. Since the tree had not been fruitful, the landowner had decided to cut it down. A good agriculturist would never allow an unproductive tree to waste the earth's elements and harm other trees. The gardener though intercedes for this tree – "Let it alone for one more year" – he would have tried his best to save it, but if it then produced nothing, the landowner would have finally had it destroyed.

We may think that this man was quite impatient; he should have waited a little longer. However, these three or four years represent the length of our lives which is unknown and mysterious to each of us. Conversion is always urgent! We cannot wait for tomorrow because it may be too late. I know people who insist on committing the same sins presuming that one day they would repent and ask for God's forgiveness. I've seen brothers and sisters who consciously do wrong with the purpose of going to confession afterwards. Be careful; it does not work like that! God is merciful and patient, but He is also just and does not waste time.

Conversion is about a sincere transformation; the once barren tree was now fruitful and lush. The Lord did not need to cut it down anymore for it had really changed and was contributing to the beauty of the garden. So go and be a "fruitful tree" as soon as possible! Repent and believe in the Gospel. Today is the acceptable time; today is the day of salvation!


