The Miracle at Cana

This Sunday's Gospel talks about the wedding at Cana. All was going well and expected to go on well when something happened – the wine ran out. There was no more wine and Mary came to know of it. Mary went and said to Jesus: *"They have no wine."* And the reply of Jesus was quite unexpected: *"Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come."* The reply that Jesus gave to Mary was almost equivalent to a *"So what?"* or *"It's none of my business."*

Whatever it may be, the reply of Jesus to His mother seemed rather blunt. Yet, it can be said that Jesus was clear with His reply. It was as clear as a *"No"*; no wine means no wine. But for Mary, no wine does not mean no hope. It was as if she was putting her own faith to the test when she said to the servants: *"Do whatever He tells you."* She dared to believe that Jesus would do something sooner or later.

What Jesus wants to tell us is to pray with conviction and confidence. God knows what we need but we need to have more conviction and confidence in our prayers and that His hour will come. Mary had that conviction and confidence that the hour of Jesus would come and that was why she was able to tell the servants: *"Do whatever He tells you."*

Our reflection is: do we have the same conviction and confidence like Mary when it looks like our prayer does not get answered by God? Why?

Latest COVID-19 Updates



The Provincial Government of Ontario has announced that we are now in a modified Step 2 of

the Roadmap to Reopening. Capacity restrictions for places of worship are set at 50% of pre-COVID capacity however, distancing of 2 metres (6 feet) must be maintained by those not from the same family.

- A new change concerns testing positive for the virus with the resulting self-isolation period of 5 days instead of 10 days after the onset of symptoms. Members of the household also need to self-isolate. All public health and safety measures such as masking and physical distancing are to be followed.
- Contact tracing is to be implemented again given the increased potential of positive cases. This requires that <u>our parishioners</u> would self sign-in on a sheet in the foyer before entering the church.
- Congregational singing at this time is to be discouraged but a cantor or small choir remains acceptable.
- The maximum number of persons for indoor gatherings is 10 which means that all inperson meetings should be held virtually wherever possible.
- Anyone who is not feeling well should not attend Mass at this time but watch Mass at home. Parishioners should not congregate in groups before or after Mass.

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
