Our First Refugee Family - 1980

Recently the parish office received an email, subject: Locating Lost Sponsors. Starting in 1979, 60,000 refugees from the Indochina area settled in Canada in less than two years. Fr. E.J. Platt, our pastor at that time, agreed that the parish would support a boat refugee family. In January 1980 the Duong family arrived from a refugee camp in Thailand. As the eldest daughter, Chi, said in the email, the sponsorship..." gave us a new life...". To and Linh Duong, with Hung Tang ("grandma" to us), and seven children spent a year with St. Thomas More Parish. To share some highlights, the two eldest girls, Chi and Phung, are married. Chi has three children and lives in Woodbridge; the remainder of the family live in Etobicoke. Phung wins prizes for her wonderful gardens. To had several businesses before retiring. He and Linh have travelled to visit relatives worldwide.

We were so excited that Chi reached out to the parish to reconnect with the sponsors and share with us the news of their challenges and successes as they built their new lives in Canada. They hope to connect with the families that worked closely with them during that year.

Saint Thomas More Feast Day on June 22

Sir Thomas More, Lord Chancellor of England, was a trusted member of a group working with King Henry VIII. He was a lawyer, author, scholar and humanist. But in the first half of the 1500s the Reformation had started in Europe, and there were some people in England who wanted to undermine the authority of the Church. The king wanted to marry another woman and asked for an annulment from his current wife but the leaders of the Church would not agree, so he began replacing the Church's authority with civil law. Sir Thomas More would not agree with the king's defining what it meant to be Catholic in England, although many others went along with the king. When the king asked the bishops to give him authority to govern the Church, they refused – until he threatened them with life imprisonment and even death. Most of the bishops, priests and officials were afraid and accepted the king's decision.

Sir Thomas More continued to refuse to give in to the king, because he knew that no secular power had jurisdiction over souls or the Church. He spoke well at his trial but was condemned to death. He was beheaded after asking for prayers for himself and for the king, saying that he died the king's good servant, but God's servant first. He was canonized in 1935.

The example of Sir Thomas More, martyr, is important, especially in this day and age. He serves as a model of charity, courage and fidelity for all.
